His dramatic versatility extends to powerhouse performances as Falstaff, Gianni Schicchi, the Sacristan in Tosca, Sulpice in The Daughter of the Regiment, and comic gems like Benoit and Alcindoro in La Bohème.

Guidarelli's career has brought him to top stages across the U.S. including Palm Beach Opera, Opera Tampa, Opera Las Vegas, Central City Opera, New Jersey State Opera, Opera Theater of Connecticut, Syracuse Opera, and beyond.
